
## Daphne Caruana Galizia Speak the Truth Even if Your Voice Shakes DI' LA VERITÀ ANCHE SE LA TUA VOCE TREMA

The book Daphne Caruana Galizia was working on at the time of her assassination.

"There are crooks everywhere you look now, the situation is desperate." These are the last words that Daphne Caruana Galizia posted on *Running Commentary*, at 2.35 pm on 16<sup>th</sup> October 2017. Minutes later, the Peugeot 108 in which Daphne was heading away from Dar Rihana exploded, and that sentence unwittingly became her final message to readers of the blog. Daphne paid with her life for thirty years of investigative journalism in which she exposed the dark side of Malta, from political corruption, the drug trade and money laundering, to the influence exerted by the Azerbaijani regime over local politics, Malta's role in the Panama Papers scandal and the sale of Maltese citizenship – accounting for 2.5% of the island nation's GDP. Daphne's last words will remain a painful warning amid the flowers at the site of her makeshift, unofficial memorial.

#### DAPHNE CARUANA GALIZIA

a Maltese journalist and blogger, wrote for the *Sunday Times* of *Malta*, for *Malta Independent* and for the blog *Running Commentary*, opened in 2008. She was murdered in an attack on October 16th, 2017.

# First published in 1973, this novel is a small miracle.

Leo, a young man from Milan, arrives in Rome in the years following the economic boom. There, in a city drenched in the *dolce vita* atmosphere, he falls in love with the unpredictable *femme fatale* Arianna. Going from one job to the other, unable to pass the shadow line of age, he spends his time in a boheme of alcohol, run-down hotels, dinners at rich and well-educated friends', that help him not to starve. He has no aspiration whatsoever. While all his friends want to graduate, get married, get rich, he doesn't: it feels better to let himself go in that sweet alienation of the city, embodied by crazy and irresistible Arianna. Endorsed by Natalia Ginzburg, then forgotten, this novel is spreading now throughout the world, thus living a new brilliant life. <u>Camilleri has written his most intimate</u> <u>book: a letter to his great-granddaughter to</u> <u>tell her who he is, to hold hands with her</u> <u>across time.</u>

What will last of us, in the memories of those who loved us? How will our life be told to our descendants? Andrea Camilleri is writing when his great-granddaughter Matilda comes in and starts playing under the table. He realizes he doesn't want others to tell her about him when she grows up. That's why he writes this letter, wittily and sincerely recalling a whole life, enlightning the moments that made him who he is. From a theatre show in front of the Fascist hierarch Pavolini and a mafia massacre in Porto Empedocle to the encounters with his future wife Rosetta and with Elvira Sellerio, each episode is a way of talking about what makes life worth of living: roots, love, friends, politics, literature and doubt.

## GIANFRANCO CALLIGARICH

was born in Asmara, Eritrea, from a family from Trieste. He grew up in Milan before moving to Rome where he worked as a journalist and screenplayer. He wrote many successful programmes for RAI and in 1994 was the founder of the Teatro XX

Secolo. He was awarded many prizes for his plays. He is author of many novels, among which *L'ultima estate in città, Principessa, Posta prioritaria, La malinconia dei Crusich* (winner of Viareggio-Rèpaci Prize), *Tre uomini in fuga.* 

#### ANDREA CAMILLERI

(Porto Emedocle, Sicily, 1925 - Rome, 2019). He devoted himself to theatre and wrote many books, such as the ones dedicated to Commissario Montalbano, which made him famous worldwide.

Our genome is a text: a book from the past and a handbook for the future. We have been able for some years to know what's written in the genome, or better we know the letters (the genes) but are quite unsure of their syntax (how each gene interacts with the others and reacts to what comes from the outside). That's why we know if a child will have cystic fibrosis, as it depends on just one gene, but we do not know if he or she will develop Parkinson Syndrome or cancer, as they are complex diseases and depend on thousands of genes. This is the most actual challenge geneticists have to face nowadays. <u>Banality is our fixation. We want to escape</u> <u>it but the escape itself makes us more and</u> <u>more banal.</u>

We both despise and are attracted to commonplaces, and our idea of success is that everybody could notice how we avoid them. Stefano Bartezzaghi does not agree. He thinks that we got it all wrong: we should establish a good relationship with banality, ours and others'. We should face it, know it, be frank with it. We should befriend banality. He is also convinced that social networks are the perfect "habitat" to face it and get to know it. Which doesn't mean that all today's banality can be found there nor that everything appearing there is banal. They are just the perfect field of investigation.



"Failure isn't the end of it all, it is a lesson to start over. There is no such thing as fault, just mistakes not to make again." A former startupper, now a happy businessman, tells us that one can learn a lot from those start-ups that didn't make it.

An old garage, a hint of genius, some good luck and a revolutionary idea, and then money, success, happiness: an idea seemingly so easy and seducing feeding the golden myth of Silicon Valley-like start-ups. was born in 1964 in Cagliari. She has been working in the comic and illustration world since 1990, becoming one of the most beloved Italian comic authors. She was awarded the Yellow Kid Prize for the best comic author in 1999, the Gran Guinigi Prize in 2005 and the Romics Prize for the best European work in 2001. She is best known for "La bambina filosofica".




