

It's the night of the presidential elections. Bruna, a professor of Political Science in New York, has been on television, commenting on the results. But back at the apartment she shares with her husband Tom and their children, the wave of nausea that overwhelms her has nothing to do

with the racist conservatism of the new president or the loneliness that haunts her amid the thousand bright lights of Manhattan. She is pregnant by her young Afro-American student, Yunus, who, for two days now, hasn't been answering her phone calls. Yunus, aged twenty, dedicates a manuscript to her in which he tells his own story: the tale of a young man of colour to whom life leaves few choices, and who therefore makes the most radical possible one — one that takes him to Syria, to fight in a war which represents the failure of centuries of human progress.

ARIANNA FARINELLI

was born in Rome in 1975. She has been living in the United States since 2001. In 2009 she was granted a PhD in Political Science and since 2010 she has been a lecturer at Baruch College, City University of New York. This is her first novel.

Daphne Caruana Galizia Speak the Truth Even if Your Voice Shakes

DI' LA VERITÀ ANCHE SE LA TUA VOCE TREMA

The book Daphne Caruana Galizia was working on at the time of her assassination.

"There are crooks everywhere you look now, the situation is desperate." These are the last words that Daphne Caruana Galizia posted on *Running Commentary*, at 2.35 pm on 16th October 2017. Minutes later, the Peugeot 108 in which Daphne was heading away from Dar Rihana exploded, and that sentence unwittingly became her final message to readers of the blog. Daphne paid with

her life for thirty years of investigative journalism in which she exposed the dark side of Malta, from political corruption, the drug trade and money laundering, to the influence exerted by the Azerbaijani regime over local politics, Malta's role in the Panama Papers scandal and the sale of Maltese citizenship – accounting for 2.5% of the island nation's GDP. Daphne's last words will remain a painful warning amid the flowers at the site of her makeshift, unofficial memorial.

DAPHNE CARUANA GALIZIA

a Maltese journalist and blogger, wrote for "Sunday Times of Malta", for "Malta Independent" and for the blog "Running Commentary", opened in 2008. She was murdered in an attack on October 16th. 2017.

was born in Calabria, but has been living in Milan for most of his life. He is a screenwriter for Disney Italia and has written comic storylines for Sergio Bonelli, for Edizioni BD/Corriere della Sera, and the French publisher BD Music. He has also worked in radio, TV and newspapers, has translated books, and edited anthologies by Beppe Grillo and Michele Serra.

Together with Serra he wrote the monologue *Tutti i santi giorni* (produced by Teatro dei Filodrammatici in Milan). Among his books, the novels *Era solo una promessa, Lorenzo Segreto* and *La grammatica della corsa,* and the children's non-fiction books *La Repubblica a piccoli passi* and *La musica a piccoli passi*.


LA STRATEGIA DELLA CLARISSA

A detective nun, a female police officer and a case in the shadows of a cloister



the aristocratic Pennisi di Floristella family: Sister Benedetta's cousin, Marilù, a forty-year-old whose ex-husband lives in America and whose career to-date has been somewhat erratic.


While Marilù does her best to disentangle a web of guilty silence with the aid of a strange old man who talks to a ghost, the young Sister Benedetta is assisted by Maria, a simple soul and a fine cook: a modern-day Sancho Panza in holy orders who knows all too well that when evil flourishes no one should be terribly surprised.

SILVANA LA SPINA

A young woman, lonely and in love with literature, writes the chronicle of her fight with her father's death: the two had shared a happy relationship during her happy childhood, a hard one during her teenage years. But now that the man is dead too many questions lay unanswered: who was the young doctorworker who always sided with the poor, who always had someone to save, who was sentenced to jail for taking part in

an armed band? And why did he never want to tell his daughter about those years? The Magnificent Eulalia is the collection of four short stories with which the author made her debut in 1988, winning the Premio Berto. The first of the stories is the tale of Eulalia and her career, in the course of which she enters the world of touring theatre, becomes a famous singer and falls in love with the reflection of a man she has seen in a mirror. The

second is the story of a master sculptor and his rebellious apprentice. The final two tales, for which the setting is a prison, are linked by the theme of music. At an undefined point in the past the protagonist of Capriolo's novel *The Helmsman* finds himself irresistibly attracted to a woman's arm which is adorned with a bracelet in the shape of a serpent, and the sight of which draws him into a strange, dark series of events.

PAOLA CAPRIOLO

was born in Milan in 1962. Her novels include *II doppio* regno, Vissi d'amore, Una di loro, Qualcosa nella notte, Una luce nerissima, II pianista muto, Caino, Mi ricordo and, with Bompiani, Avventure di un gatto viaggiatore (2017) and

Marie e il signor Mahler (2019). She is also an essayist, an author of children's books, and a translator specializing in the German classics, including Goethe, Kafka, Kleist and Thomas Mann.


Vasari's *The Lives of the Artists* is an extraordinary document recounting the stories of the founding figures of Western art, but for many reasons it is also far from accessible for most contemporary readers. Inspired by Vasari's *Lives*, Carabba has embarked upon a piece of narrative archaeology: in each of Vasari's

biographies he has found the seeds of what develops into utterly fanciful (or entirely plausible) episodes via which he reintroduces us to the greatest artists of the Renaissance from a compelling new angle. Each tale explores explores a state of mind or a state of grace. These are stories from the past, but the emotions they portray are utterly contemporary. From Leonardo da Vinci to Titian to Cimabue and Michelangelo, the history of art becomes an endless source of images and feelings that enrich lives.

ENZO FILENO CARABBA

is the author of novels short stories, radio plays, children's books and opera librettos. In 1990 he won the Premio Calvino with the novel *Jakob Pesciolini* (1992), the first volume of a fantasy trilogy which also includes *La regola del silenzio* (1994) and *La Foresta finale* (1997). His subsequent books have included *Pessimi Segnali*, *Attila*,

Con un poco di zucchero and La zia subacquea e altri abissi famigliari, as well as the middle-grade fantasy saga Fuga da Magopoli and Battaglia a Magopoli. He writes for "Il Corriere Fiorentino" and "Corriere della Sera". His novels have been translated into several languages.

One day in April 1967. It's raining, Italian singer Patty Pravo celebrates her nineteenth birthday, football player Burgnich scores his second goal for Inter at San Siro against Bologna, and the life of a family changes forever. One of the children playing in the living room is the author of this story. In the next room, his younger brother is dying of leukaemia, a disease for which the following year there will be a cure. On this day the narrator

starts a journey towards the future which has been denied to his brother Claudio. It is also a journey the narrator conducts into the past, with the feeling of someone breathing behind him, a feeble voice insinuating itself among his thoughts, unwilling to be ignored. Di Stefano gathers and preserves traces of an entire universe of non-prominent though very relevant lives, gathering them around, finding the strength to evoke and say goodbye for ever to his little brother, at once loved, envied, tormented and lost.

PAOLO DI STEFANO

was born in Avola, Sicily; he is a correspondent for "Corriere della Sera". He has published poems, short stories, investigation reports, and novels such as *La catastròfa.*Marcinelle 8 agosto 1956 (2011), Giallo d'Avola (2013),
I pesci devono nuotare (2015) and Respirano i muri

(with Massimo Siragusa, 2018). Under the nom de plume Nino Motta he has published *La parrucchiera di Pizzuta* (Bompiani, 2017). He has won several literary awards, such as Grinzane Cavour, SuperFlaiano, SuperVittorini, Campiello, Volponi. Lo Straniero. and Viareggio-Rèpaci.



Since then he has published a host of books, including *Tu non tacere, Follia docente, Nonnitudine*, the eight Inspector Stucky novels, from which a film starring Giuseppe Battiston was made in 2017, and the much-loved

ALBERTO MORAVIA

pseudonym of Alberto Pincherle (Rome 1907-1990), was a writer, a journalist, an essayist, a travel reporter and a playwright. He is one of the most important Italian novelists of the 20th century. He contributed to newspapers such as "La Stampa", "Il Corriere della Sera" and "L'Espresso". Among his most famous books translated worldwide: Gli indifferenti, La ciociara, La romana,



As a child he never smiled, but experienced his first true pain at the age of 28, the day of Socrates' death. Aristocles was one of his pupils and from his master's teaching he set off his path of thought and created a whole philosophical universe. Annalisa Ambrosio tells us the life of Plato by making it similar to our ordinary ones.







(1826-1890), pen name of Carlo Lorenzini, was the author of many books for children, but his fame is bound to his masterpiece, The Adventures of Pinocchio, unanimously regarded as one of the most important novels of 19th century Italian literature.

LORENZO MATTOTTI

is one of the most important contemporary illustrators. He was born in Brescia in 1954 but lives and works in Paris. His work has been released to widespread acclaim from critics and readers since 1970s. In 1983 he founded, together with other artists, the Valvoline group that marked a turning point in contemporary graphic novel production worldwide. He was awarded the Bratislava Grand Prix, one of the most important prizes for children's literature.


LUCA DONINELLI




that wins as the reader looks at these characters with human understanding, that is indulgency over their and his own whims and weirdness.



ALBERTO MORAVIA

pseudonym of Alberto Pincherle (Rome 1907-1990), was a writer, a journalist, an essayist, a travel reporter and a playwright. He is one of the most important Italian novelists of the 20th century. He contributed to newspapers such as "La Stampa", "II Corriere della Sera" and "L'Espresso". Among his most famous books translated worldwide: *Gli indifferenti, La ciociara, La romana,*

Racconti romani and La noia. In 1952 he was awarded the Strega Prize for his short stories, blacklisted by the Church. Many of his novels have been made into films, including La ciociara by Vittorio De Sica, Il disprezzo by Jean-Luc Godard and Il conformista by Bernardo Bertolucci.

Wu Ming have also written solo novels, travel stories, reportages and essays on literature. Each member has

John Steinbeck enjoyed the duties of fatherhood and dispensed advice to his two sons when it was requested and sometimes when it was not. When in 1958 Steinbeck's son Thom was fourteen and attending boarding school in Connecticut he met a young girl named Susan with whom he thought he might
